### Project Summary

ArtsWA is the caretaker of one of the most significant statewide collections of public art in the country. However, there has never been a proportional investment in the care of those works. This request will allow us to complete thirteen significant artwork restorations in all corners of the state. The thirteen proposed projects are located at K-12 public schools, on college and university campuses, and at state agency facilities. They represent highly visible artworks—most of them outdoor sculptures—with collective repair needs that outpace ArtsWA's budget. They are found across twelve counties and thirteen legislative districts. Each is vulnerable to total loss if ArtsWA does not intervene quickly.

### Project Description

**What is the problem/opportunity? Identify: priority, underserved people/communities, operating budget savings, public safety improvements & clarifying details. Preservation projects: include information about the current condition of the facility/system.**

Washington State has invested more than \$46 million in artworks that improve K-12 schools, college and university campuses, and state agency facilities. The 5,000 artworks that make up the State Art Collection are irreplaceable. Yet, it has only been in the past few years that ArtsWA has been able to grow our staff to perform maintenance on artworks in the Collection. There is 40-years' worth of deferred maintenance with which to contend. Artworks often need significant repair to get them into a maintainable condition. If funded, this request will address the significant needs of thirteen artworks. It will bring them into maintainable condition and remove them from ArtsWA's conservation backlog.

The communities that are the homes to these state-owned artworks deserve better. They want artworks that are in good repair and convey the care they have for their community. These artworks represent nearly all corners of the state. They are in Bellingham, Chehalis, Colville, Connell, Covington, Lynnwood, Pullman, Seattle, Sequim, Spokane, Steilacoom, Sunnyside, and Vancouver.

Proposed projects include repainting outdoor sculptures, structural engineering checks to ensure safety, restoration of outdoor wood artworks, the replacement of crumbling footings, and improvements to ADA accessibility.

At Colville High School in Stevens County, a 30-year-old sculpture is overdue for repainting (Figure 1). A local vendor will be hired to sandblast, repair the metal, and apply primer and topcoats of the sculpture's eight colors.

At Western Washington University, a work by the internationally renowned artist and WWU alumnus David Ireland, needs to be removed, sandblasted, repainted, and re-installed in a more visible area to ensure that this valuable artwork is also lasting.

Artist Michael Loomis created an outdoor wood and concrete sculpture for Burnt Bridge Creek Elementary in Vancouver. The artwork evokes the historic bridge that is at the center of the school's name. After thirty-five years, its wood posts are overdue for replacement to ensure the safety of kids and the

artwork. ArtsWA estimates that 1/3 of the structural posts are showing signs of rot (Figure 2).

**What will the request produce or construct (predesign/design of a building, additional space, etc.)? When will the project start/end? Identify if the project can be phased, and if so, which phase is included in the request. Provide detailed cost backup.**

The proposed projects aim to restore thirteen artworks currently in poor condition into a state of good condition. The projects will begin at the start of the FY25 fiscal year. We anticipate that together the projects will require 1-2 fiscal years to complete. This request includes all phases.

**How would the request address the problem or opportunity identified in question 1? What would be the result of not taking action?**

This request supports the repair of thirteen significant and highly visible artworks. The collective cost of these projects is beyond the capacity of ArtsWA's annual budget. It would take years to incorporate these large-scale repairs into our annual project load. Not acting will result in the loss of some or all these works from the State Art Collection. Each of these projects is costly enough that we will not be able to accomplish them in the near-term. If not addressed, deterioration will eventually no longer be reversible or repairable.

**What alternatives were explored? Why was the recommended alternative chosen? Be prepared to provide detailed cost backup. If this project has an associated predesign, please summarize the alternatives the predesign considered.**

ArtsWA considered not putting this request forward. However, we are the State Art Collection's caretakers and advocates. It is our responsibility to alert authorizers that deterioration is imperiling these artworks. While this list could have been longer, we feel that this proposal is attainable within a 1–2-year period. Success with this request can inform our approach to the ongoing care and funding of the Collection, particularly when our annual budget cannot absorb significant artwork needs.

**Which clientele would be impacted by the budget request? Where and how many units would be added, people or communities served, etc.**

This request would benefit campus communities from elementary schools to our state universities. It also includes artworks located in spaces frequented by the public. For example, a series of six 17-foot tall, forged, and painted steel sculptures line a prominent walking path and Highway 395 in Connell. In total, we estimate that more than 76,000 people are immediately impacted by this work.

ArtsWA selected projects that ensure all parts of the state benefit from this funding. The communities represented are urban and rural. They include Washington's biggest city and some of its smaller towns (Connell and Colville), and represent twelve of Washington's counties and thirteen Legislative districts. We selected projects that can often be done by general contractors with guidance from art conservators so the financial benefits of this work would be dispersed across Washington.

The artwork for the State Art Collection is chosen by representatives from the communities that host the artworks. The Collection tells us about community values and aspirations across Washington. It also reflects how both have changed over time. The works that make up the State Art Collection are an incomparable cultural asset and one for which the State is responsible.
