

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**Number 002371 - Number of external messages delivered to DEL audiences**



**A002 Child Care Licensing**

Licensing focuses on the safety and health requirements that serve as the foundation from which quality learning opportunities can be built. Licensing staff offer orientations for providers, process background checks, inspect, issue licenses and monitor facilities, complete complaint inspections, and take corrective action as necessary. Licensors help providers enter the Early Achievers Washington quality improvement system.

This activity also encompasses the resources for oversight and policy for the working connections, seasonal and homeless child care subsidies, as well as writing rules and interpreting regulations for licensing programs, and administration of the collective bargaining agreement with family child care homes.



**Number 002400 - Maximum number of days for licensing complaint inspections to be completed or closed**





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

**A003 Child Care and Early Learning Quality Initiatives**

The Department of Early Learning develops and implements programs and activities which provide comprehensive consumer education to parents and the public, increase parental choice, research and evaluation, and improve the quality and availability of early education opportunities. These initiatives include:

- A quality rating improvement system (Early Achievers) which supports and incentivizes increased quality in family home and center-based early learning and school-age settings
- Resource and referral support for parents
- Professional development opportunities (training, coaching, scholarships and higher education), and registry for providers.
- The Washington Kindergarten Inventory of Developing Skills (WaKIDS), which assesses children’s progress as they begin kindergarten, and gives parents, teachers and providers a more “whole child” perspective so education can be tailored to the child’s need.
- Partnering with the Department of Health's CHILD Profile to send information to all new parents in Washington about choosing quality child care.
- Statewide public information campaigns to educate families and prevent child abuse.






**Number 002374 - Number of early learning programs participating in Early Achievers QRIS Level 2.**

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
**Number 002375 - Number of early learning programs participating in Early Achievers QRIS Level 3.**

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
**Number 002376 - Number of early learning programs participating in Early Achievers QRIS Level 4.**


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**Number 001667 - Number of early learning providers enrolled in DEL's WA Scholarship program**


**Number 002389 - Number of early learning providers who receive certificate, credential or degree.**



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


**Number 001668 - Number of providers who receive degree or credential as a result of WA Scholarship program**

**A004 Child Care Subsidies**



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Number 001671 - Number of children served by Seasonal Child Care subsidies





**A005 Early Learning Programs**

*Appropriation Period: 2013-15 Activity Version: 2C - Enacted Recast Sort By: Activity*

The department administers several programs in collaboration with partners to create an early learning system that helps ensure safe and nurturing environments for all children through positive early learning programs, services, and supports. These programs help prepare kids so they are ready to learn when they reach kindergarten.

- The Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program (ECEAP) is a comprehensive school readiness program serving low-income and at-risk three- and four-year-old children and their families. ECEAP services address the many factors that affect a child’s development and learning ability, including preschool education, health services coordination, nutrition, and family support.
- The Head Start State Collaboration Office (HSSCO) works to develop multiagency private/public partnerships at the state level that support Head Start programs and low-income children and families in Washington.
- The Early Support for Infants and Toddlers (ESIT) program provides services for infants and toddlers, birth to three, who have disabilities and/or developmental delays. Eligible infants and toddlers and their families in Washington State are entitled to individualized, quality early intervention services in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Part C.
- The Medicaid Treatment Child Care (MTCC) program is a contracted service that provides intense child development services to children ages birth to five with mental and/or behavioral issues and who are at risk of child abuse and neglect.
- Home Visiting programs offer voluntary, family-focused services to expectant parents and families with new babies and young children. Home visiting supports the child and family by buffering the effects of risk factors and stress in the family
- The Strengthening Families Washington program (formerly the Council for Children and Families) focuses on preventing child maltreatment by supporting programs that increase families’ strengths, provide concrete resources, improve parenting skills and increase knowledge of child development. CCF also supports a number of innovative and research-based strategies that have shown evidence of improving outcomes to create healthier families and children.





**Number 002397 - Number of communities providing home visiting services funded by the Home Visiting Services Account**





**Number 002398 - Number of families receiving home visiting services, funded by the Home Visiting Services Account**





**Percent 002392 - Percentage of ECEAP and Head Start sites enrolled in Early Achievers levels 3-5.**





**Percent 001674 - Percentage of ECEAP children who increase social-emotional skills between autumn and spring**






**Percent 001675 - Percentage of ECEAP children with up-to-date well child exams**



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

Percent 001673 - Percentage of ECEAP slots that are fully enrolled





**Percent 002396 - Percentage of ESIT children with appropriate behaviors to get needs met.**




