




Awareness of Breaking and Entering in the Neighborhood - 2004.


Awareness of Drug Selling in Neighborhood - 2004.


Awareness of Drug Using In Neighborhood - 2204.


Awareness of Gun Crimes in the Neighborhood - 2004.


Awareness of Murder in the Neighborhood - 2004.


Awareness of Sexual Assault in the Neighborhood - 2004.


Awareness of Theft of Personal Property in Neighborhood - 2004.


Awareness of Violent Physical Attacks in the Neighborhood - 2004.




Incidence of Property Crimes per 1,000 Population. Excluding Larceny.


Incidence of Violent Crimes per 1,000 Population.


Percent of High School Students in Schools with Geo-Mapping Completed.


Percent of Students in Schools with Geo-Mapping Completed.


Rate of Unintentional Non-Fatal Injury Hospitalizations.


