I. CALL TO ORDER

Dave Boerner, Chair, called the meeting to order.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The Commission did not vote to approve the minutes from April 2016.

III. WASHINGTON IN THE ERA OF MASS INCARCERATION

Chair Boerner presented an analysis over the last 30 years of incarceration in Washington. He thanked Stacy Smith of the Minority and Justice Commission for her assistance with the presentation.

IV. SECOND LOOK 3-STRIKES PROPOSAL

Chair Boerner provided a review of the second look proposal approved by the Commission. There was discussion on whether there was buy-in by the groups represented in the Commission.

V. DOC PRISON PROGRAMMING

Keri L. Waterland, Assistant Secretary of Offender Change Division at DOC, presented to members on description, data and budget information related to prison programming.

VI. OTHER BUSINESS

Chair Boerner informed members that the Senate Law & Justice report on the DOC early release issue includes a recommendation to “simplify Washington sentencing code in a manner that does not reduce punishment or compromise public safety.” He said he has been trying to find out what ‘simplification’ means and that it is a worthy goal but not an easy goal. He proposed creating a work group to weigh in on and offer assistance to that process. Judge Moreno and Tim Wettack volunteered for the work group.

Bonnie Glenn noted that JR also has a presentation on mass incarceration of juveniles.

Chair Boerner said the July and August meetings would likely be teleconference meetings if they weren’t cancelled. He expects the next in-person meeting to be the September meeting. Members will be notified of meeting statuses.
