**I. CALL TO ORDER**

Kecia Rongen called the meeting to order and Keri-Anne took roll call.

**III. SEX OFFENDER HOUSING REPORT – FINAL REVIEW**

Anmarie Aylward noted that there are a few areas in the report that still need to be reviewed. She inquired if everyone was satisfied with the delineation of the cities whose ordinances were grandfathered in and those who had ordinances that were older but not grandfathered in. The group indicated they were.

Candice Bock commented that she had concerns about the language that indicates a direct impact of local ordinances on clustering of sex offender housing because there is clustering in cities that do not have residency restrictions. Briahna Taylor agreed

and suggested a wording change to the last few sentences under Recommendation 1 would help.

Candice also commented that she was hoping for a closer connection of clustering and the impact on communities to Recommendations 2, 3 and 4. Council member Door added that one of the items outlined in the request letter was the need for the general public to feel safe in their communities. She feels that is not reflected in the report. Anmarie indicated that Recommendations 2, 3 and 4 were meant to address how entities could obtain more information or let citizens know where to find information that would help them feel safe in their communities.

Michael O'Connell noted that perhaps the report doesn't sufficiently address how to help the public feel safe in their communities. Keri-Anne reminded the members of the discussions related to perceived safety and the reality of safety the workgroup had and said that she thought that the report presents areas where the risks lie and, if addressed, could result in greater real safety to the community.

Anmarie reviewed the changes to the report that had been discussed during the meeting. Keri-Anne, Michael, Council member Door, Candice and Briahna offered to provide language to Anmarie related to the areas they discussed.

Anmarie said she would have a final version ready for review by Friday.
