The Public Disclosure Commission administers and enforces the laws pertaining to the disclosure and financing of political campaigns, lobbying, and financial affairs of elected officials and candidates for public offices. This law includes prohibitions on the use of public agency resources to assist in campaigns and restrictions on personal use of contributions. The commission is also responsible for enforcing the contribution limits and other campaign finance restrictions established in law.

Agency Mission

The Public Disclosure Commission was created and empowered by initiative of the people to provide timely and meaningful public access to accurate information about the financing of political campaigns, lobbyist expenditures, the financial affairs of public officials and candidates, and to ensure compliance with and equitable enforcement of Washington's disclosure and campaign finance laws.
