Specification for Class of

EGG INSPECTOR 2

Abolished Initially Effective January 13, 2006 Abolished Final Effective February 10, 2006

<u>Definition</u>: Inspects and enforces laws and regulations pertaining to handling and sale of eggs in an assigned geographic area.

Typical Work

Samples, inspects, handles, grades, and weighs shell eggs for grade, weight, size, and interior quality;

Impounds improperly graded or otherwise unlawful eggs; releases eggs for sale after re-grading;

Inspects for egg seal on cartons and to ascertain if supplier or producer is licensed egg dealer;

Prepares grade report sheets on each lot of eggs inspected at retail stores and egg storage or processing plants;

Checks retailers' invoices showing dates, grades, and sizes of eggs delivered;

Inspects rotation practices, signs, State seals, and labeling of egg containers and sub-containers;

Sells egg dealer licenses; instructs new egg dealer licensees and assists them in gaining familiarity with State Egg Law;

Writes reports summarizing inspections;

Performs other work as required.

Knowledge and Abilities

Knowledge of: eggs, their grades and handling; State and Federal laws and regulations governing handling and sale of shell eggs.

Ability to: candle and grade eggs; enforce law firmly, but tactfully; write clearly and legibly; travel frequently and for extended periods.

Minimum Qualifications

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Graduation from high school $\underline{\text{and}}$ two years of experience in production, storage or sale of $\underline{\text{shell}}$ eggs.

OR

One year as an Egg Inspector 1.

Additional qualifying experience may be substituted, year for year, for education.

<u>Note</u>: Incumbents automatically move to the 2 level after completion of one year at the 1 level.
